Ebooks

Paper, ink, a binding – the essential elements of a book, right? Not any longer!

The materials needed to produce the new breed of book include text stored on a microchip and viewed via a computer or digital reader. This new medium is called the electronic book or ebook (or e-book or eBook or e-Book). (Of course, there is e-ink, but that's another story [http://www.eink.com/]).

Electronic or digital books have been around for a number of years – long before the technology of the Web came into being. In 1971, Michael Hart was given \$100 million worth of mainframe computer time by the Materials Research Lab at the University of Illinois. He developed the concept of taking books and other documents that were no longer restricted by copyright and making them available electronically to anyone who had access to a computer modem. The first document he entered, into what would later become the Project Gutenberg database, was the "Declaration of Independence." Approximately 40 texts are still being entered each month. These titles fall into the public domain and were published prior to 1923.

Format Standards

Ebook technology has evolved from basic text that could only be ftp'd or emailed to enhanced html, RTF (rich text format), PDF (Acrobat Reader), XML, LIT (Microsoft Reader), and OEB (Open eBook), and EBX (Acrobat eBook Reader).

OEB written by the Open Ebook Forum [http://www.openebook.org/], specifies the format of content for converting print into digital form.

EBX is a standard for distributing OEB and PDF etexts while protecting copyright.
